

Greetings and best wishes to all of you as you work in your gardens this summer!

Here on Shady Lane the recovery from recent large scale natural disasters is more complete and looking more like what we had become accustomed to. The "jungle" of the woods is filling in, just like the forester told me, now two years post tornado. The perennial beds are recovering from two summer droughts...although I was surprised to see that age old standard hostas had taken more of a beating than I had anticipated. They are smaller (expected since August was dry and that period of root growth influences following year leaf growth and development), but are putting forth. We have enhanced with compost and the layers of shredded paper topped with hardwood mulch, so now the worms must do their part!

The daylilies still need more weeding...but since they have started to bloom, perhaps that will draw me out more in the mornings to get that task completed. The fish and the pond are happy and lilies are blooming. I eagerly await the first lotus blossom!

It was amazing, and slightly overwhelming to take in the impact that garden clubs have across the country and the world! It also was a great opportunity to network with others to gain insight and ideas.

The other was completed by Green Thumb Garden Club at Gibson County Fairgrounds in Princeton. It was wonderfully conducted in a more casual manner, with the addition of re-enactors in full civil war time period garb as there also was the rededication of a plaque to honor the fairground space having served as a training camp during the Civil War! They followed the dedication with nice refreshments in the poultry building which that garden club has been instrumental in helping to restore to usable space. # 2013-2015 State Project—Trees Background and Guidelines by Sarah Nahmias

As a lover of trees, and having experienced loss of great well aged trees a couple of years ago due to a tornado, my husband and I had the good fortune to be involved in a "Re-Leaf" program in our hometown. Seeing the great success of that program which not only replaced some trees in public spaces but also extended to area parks and other public spaces, we thought "Why not make this a garden club state wide project?!" And there it began!

In April of this year, the TGCI State Board approved my request for \$4200 to be allotted for a statewide tree planting effort. It was decided that up to \$300 per award and two awards per district would be available.

General guidelines would include:

- Planting in a public space
- Having an Arbor Day or other public educational program coinciding or coordinated with the tree dedication
- Acknowledgment of The Garden Club of Indiana as a sponsor and collaborator in this effort
- Raising or obtaining an actual or in-kind value donation of at least \$100 by the sponsoring club or district. This shows commitment of that club or district to care for the tree on an ongoing basis. This could be as simple as \$100 from the treasury to aid in the planting or care of the tree or could be a labor donation by the nurseryman who is going to plant the tree.
- Educating the public about "not topping trees" and other issues of tree care
- Establish benefit of tree in a public space
- Determination of particular public space and its significance

In filling out the online application for the grant money, please include as much information as possible to assure your serious consideration for this award. Awards will be on a first come first served basis, if all criteria are met. Receiving entity must be a 501c3 or 501c4 and show proof of same.

The Garden Club of Indiana, Inc reserves the right to review or reject any application deemed ineligible. Decision of The Garden Club of Indiana, Inc is final.


